THE RIDE IS THE STUNNING NEW COUNTRY
PARK AT ABBEY BARN PARK, A HISTORIC
LANDSCAPE SURROUNDED BY MATURE TREES.

Once part of Wycombe Abbey Park, the land around the Abbey Barn Park site has a long history. Loakes House was the original manor building, transformed in the early 1800s by architect James Wyatt into a striking Gothic-style residence, and renamed Wycombe Abbey.

The Ride was originally a stretch of landscaped green space created in the 1800's when an avenue of Lime trees was planted in Wycombe Abbey Park. This extended from Daws Hill House, a large farm house owned by the 3rd Lord Carrington. The original planting was later supplemented in the 1900s with a second line creating the view that can still be seen today.

Work is now beginning on breathing new life into The Ride and making it the centrepiece of Abbey Barn Park. With 34 acres of beautifully landscaped green space, it will feel like an extension of residents' gardens. There will be allotments to tend, play areas to scramble over, lawns to picnic on, and fields to run through. A range of different sports can be played on the multi-use games area, while community gardens will give residents the opportunity to meet neighbours and make friends.

Children will love the exciting play area. Inspired by a badger sett with tunnels, dens, slide, climbing logs and a labyrinth of paths, it will be the perfect place to let them and their imaginations run free.

Adults will be able to get active on the fitness trail too, a 1.5km circular loop through the lime trees, with outdoor exercise equipment for a workout in the fresh air.

As well as residents, The Ride will also be a welcoming place for wildlife. Planting includes native trees, shrubs and rough grassland to create a flourishing natural habitat and attract a rich diversity of animals, insects and birds. With this abundance of space, flora and fauna, The Ride is the ideal place for you to reconnect with nature.

The Chiltern Rangers is a local voluntary group that looks after the woods. They will have a new base at Abbey Barn Park, supporting them in their work and making it easy for you to be involved with their important work.

Abbey Barn Park makes spending time outside so accessible. Just open your doo and off you go. Whether it's to get active, enjoy stress-relieving activities such as gardening, or simply meet with friends in the open air, you will feel so much better physically and mentally for being outside and connecting with nature.

Grace Zetter and Hannah Blunt are a creative partnership of interior designers known as Zetter Blunt Design. Having worked together for seven years, they have developed a strong working relationship with a unique style, as well as their own little black book of suppliers and artisans.

Zetter Blunt Design creates confident, on-trend aesthetics, embracing seasonal colour trends, organic materials and artwork to create distinctive interiors for developers, which perspective buyers will remember.

Berkeley Homes recently commissioned Zetter Blunt Design to style two of the properties within its first collection of show homes at Abbey Barn Park, and showcase the range of flexible accommodation on offer.

Grace and Hannah explain their approach to creating these stylish and memorable interiors. "We design spaces that reflect the character and lifestyle of the perspective purchasers, and curate carefully selected pieces that will make a lasting impact on them, bringing out the best in the space given.

"Abbey Barn Park is a stunning new development featuring a wide selection of properties designed to appeal to a broad range of purchasers. We were asked by Berkeley to design two houses – one with three bedrooms, the other with four – to reflect the lifestyles of two specific purchaser profiles: a young couple creating their first home; and an established family with three children.

"The Beech is a detached three bedroom home (1075 sq.ft), featuring a large living/dining entertaining space with separate kitchen. This house has been styled to reflect the lifestyle of a young couple of creative professionals, who work in London and have just bought their first home together.

"We adopted a style influenced by a new trend called Japandi – a blend of Danish and Japanese culture – accessorising the home with fabrics inspired by the latest fashion trends. Cobalt blue was our chosen statement colour – a big Pantone trend for 2020 – complemented by a mix of textures, fabrics and artwork styles to create key points of interest for perspective buyers. The main entertaining space showcases an eclectic mix of ceramic accessories and Danish artwork to complete the look.

"The Hazel is a substantial detached four bedroom house (1602 sq.ft), which reflects the lifestyle of a family of five. There's a teenage son, who currently goes to Royal Grammar School in High Wycombe, and three-year-old twin girls.

"Our aim with this property was to showcase effortless, natural family living by blending traditional styles with how families want to live today. William Morris wallpaper and bespoke panelling in the kitchen are complemented by one-off textural art pieces and bold colour palettes such as chalky emerald green. We also chose to create a formal living area offering a luxurious escape for adults to socialise and entertain.

"Prospective buyers at Abbey Barn Park will all have their own personal tastes and styles, so it's key for the homes to be designed to appeal to a wide range of preferences."
