# WE TOPPED OUT AT HARTLAND MANOR

We have reached a significant milestone at Hartland Village with the topping out of Hartland Manor, a tradition in construction which celebrates the completion of the main structure of a new building.

Alan Hopley, the development's Senior Project Manager, tied a yew branch to the roof of Hartland Manor. He said: "We're really proud to be reaching such a pinnacle construction milestone – it's hugely rewarding to see it all taking shape. Hartland Manor is at the heart of our first phase of homes; it is the focal point for residents and visitors as they drive, cycle or walk over the picturesque hump-backed bridge and lake. It sets the tone for the rest of the development with its elegant and traditional architecture."



# WE OPENED OUR COMMUNITY HUB for local students

St Edward has also launched the Community Hub at Hartland Village. This new training centre has been built for local students who want to learn construction skills.

The hub has been designed to provide a safe space where students can get hands-on experience of construction training and demonstrations, as well as short lectures, toolbox talks and theory-based studies with local college lecturers as well as St Edward staff.

Students will get a real flavour of life on a construction site, with access to the welfare and canteen facilities, and will have the opportunity to see how a large-scale development evolves in real time.

Paul Vallone, Executive Chairman at St Edward, said: "The Community Hub provides a safe space where students can get hands on experience and learn what it's really like to work on a construction site. This is a brilliant way of addressing the industry's skills gap and inspiring the next generation of construction recruits."

The Community Hub will also be available to local community groups and Job Centre Plus; St Edward is working with them to develop programmes that will boost the confidence and skills of people in the community who are unemployed.

St Edward was recently recognised locally for its employment initiatives when it won a Gold Award at Hampshire's Investors in Young People Awards. Our team is working closely with Hart District Council on their Employment and Skills Plan, which will help enable more people, whatever their age, in the local area to develop skills and discover roles within the construction industry.

He added: "We've always enjoyed meeting people from different cultures, experiences and backgrounds and this is one of the reasons we wanted to move from our previous home - we had originally relocated from London to deep in the Kent countryside, but it was too isolated for us and we wanted to be part of a thriving community again."

Jamie explains: "Hartland Village is a really special place and the St Edward team has been brilliant in helping us feel at home – at Christmas, they even helped us to organise a socially distanced mulled wine stall for the residents to help lift spirits. The community here is really beginning to thrive."



Jamie continues: "In all honesty, we didn't really mind where we were located, we just wanted to find the right house in the right place – close enough to London so we weren't too far from friends, but still near to beautiful open space. We looked online at many properties over a wide area and Hartland Village hit the mark for its ambience and surroundings. Our neighbours are from a wide mix of ages and professions – when we moved in, we instantly felt at home – you can sense the feeling of a new community being established."
