More homebuyers can call Hartland Village home, because Help to Buy is now available on a range of one and two-bedroom apartments and threebedroom houses (up to the value of £600,000).

With Help to Buy, buyers are granted a government loan worth 20 per cent of the value of their new home and only need a five per cent deposit and a 75 per cent mortgage to make up the rest. The loan is interest-free for the first five years.

FOCUS ON Community

Jennifer Upstill, Hartland Village's Community Liaison Officer, discusses the importance of community and how St Edward is creating an exciting new destination for everyone to enjoy.

66 lan you tell us a bit about your role?

My role is a brand new one, created by St Edward specifically with Hartland Village in mind. Community is at the forefront of every aspect of Hartland Village. I am working closely with local groups, clubs and businesses to make sure that everyone is involved in our plans – when we launch the Village Centre, for instance, we want local businesses to move in! Once we have residents living at Hartland Village, it'll also be my job to make sure they're involved in planning events and creating community groups that will help residents come together. Another strand of my work is related to employment skills; I'm working with contractors, local schools and colleges to inform people about the employment opportunities at Hartland Village.

Why is community so important?

Hartland Village is a long-term project and will be years in the making, but we need to make sure that when our first residents move in, they benefit from the new community straight away. Community is so important because it creates a feeling of comfort and security; knowing your children have plenty of space in which to play, feeling secure in and around your home, and having neighbours that become friends. We're not just place making at Hartland Village, we're place keeping; this is a village people will call home for life.

How do you ensure a tightknit community?

Listening to the community is really important. Early on, while I help residents form the bonds to create a new community, I will be listening to what they want from events and clubs. We want our residents to have as much influence as possible in the neighbourhood they live in. Making sure everyone feels included is also crucial – at Hartland Village there is an 'everyone welcome' mentality. I think having amenities nearby will really help too. For example, when the Country Park, Village Centre and the school are delivered, they will provide places for people to meet and socialise, helping to form friendships and eventually their own groups and clubs.

What community events do you have planned for the year?

We have a busy year in 2020. We're looking at everything from summer film screenings to firework displays for our first residents and people in the wider area. Once everyone is settled in, we can start tailoring events to suit our residents' interests. I'm really excited to get started!

How will Hartland Village fit within the wider community?

We're lucky to be located in Hart. The surrounding towns have so much going on already and there's a whole range of businesses, groups and clubs; some we're already involved with and others we'd love to find out more about. Hartland Village won't only be for the people that live here, it's going to be a brand new destination for everyone in the wider community.

HARTLAND VILLAGE JOINS FORCES WITH TWESELDOWN PRIMARY SCHOOL FOR BIG CLIMATE FIGHTBACK

St Edward recently teamed up with Tweseldown Infant School to plant a tree at Hartland Village to mark the Woodland Trust's Big Climate Fightback.

The pupils gathered to plant the Fir tree amongst the development's existing landscaping; it is just one of 174 being planted during the first phase of work at Hartland Village.

Kim Tottem, Headteacher at Tweseldown School, said:

"The tree-planting was a great way to get involved with the Woodland Trust's excellent initiative."

This is a really important topic for our students to explore and it was also enlightening to find out what goes on behind the scenes at Hartland Village!"

Danny Rowland, Sales Director at St Edward, added: "It was a real joy welcoming Tweseldown Infant School to the development. Hartland Village is really taking shape and I hope one day these children might even call it home."

"We're creating a sustainable community for everyone."

In addition to tree planting, the children learnt about the brand new lake at the development, which has been filled with recycled rainwater and is now home to wildlife, including dragonflies; even the bridge which leads over the lake has lampposts that are blacked out on one side to prevent reflective light disrupting the local bats' hunting habits.
