



Hampshire is famous for its watercress and often produces more than 300 tons of the crop each year, which makes it one of the largest producers in Europe.



The River Test is world famous for its superb trout fishing and passes through the Mottisfont Estate and some of the most picturesque villages in Hampshire






The New Forest National Park is one of the largest remaining stretches of unspoilt woodland, heathland and river valleys in Southern England with over 3,000 protected ponies which roam free

Lyndhurst known as the Capital of The New Forest since William the Conqueror established it as a royal hunting ground in 1079




Alresford & The Watercress Line Hop on board the Watercress Line steam train which used to transport locally grown watercress to markets in London

Grammar schools play a prominent role in the UK education system and historically, have their roots tracing back to the 16th century




Founded in 1382, Winchester College is the oldest independent boarding school for boys in the UK and ranks alongside Eton and Harrow as one of the world's most outstanding schools


