HENRY VIII

Kent has a rich and colourful history, which dates back thousands of years. Many people have raced to these shores and have quite rightly fallen in love with our green fields and glorious beaches, including the Romans and the Vikings.

Kent was given the title 'The Garden of England' by Henry VIII around 400 years ago. Allegedly, the Monarch tried a bowl of Kentish cherries and was so delighted by the flavour of the fruits that the title became associated with the county.


WHY LIVE IN KENT

The White Cliffs of Dover overlook the English Channel, providing sweeping views across the sea to France. These striking chalk cliffs played a pivotal role in Britain's

defence during the war.







Stretching from Surrey to the White Cliffs of Dover, the North Downs are a ridge of chalk hills which make up one of Kent's Areas of Natural Beauty.



High Weald is a Medieval landscape of rolling hills, historic woodlands and picturesque villages, just waiting to be explored.



As well as endless beaches – including Dungeness Beach, Britain's only desert – the Kentish coast is filled with peaceful bays and nature reserves.

King Henry VIII transformed the Norman Leeds Castle into a pleasure palace for himself and his first wife, Catherine of Aragon.



Described as the 'Key to England,' **Dover Castle** stands in the iconic white cliffs, overlooking the Channel. The main castle was built soon after 1066, but the site also includes a Roman lighthouse.





Historically used for drying hops as part of the brewing process, Oast Houses are scattered throughout the county, with the oldest one located at Golford, Cranbrook, dating back to the 17th century.



Ightham Mote is a 14th-century manor house with an impressive moat and gardens, which provides a perfect example of what life would have looked like in the Middle Ages.

Grammar schools play a prominent role in the UK education system and historically, have their roots tracing back to the 16th century.


Private Schools


